Dear Parents and Carers,

We celebrated International Women's Day making things for the important women in our lives.



But the highlight of the term has to be seeing animals from around the world at Knowsley Safari Park!




### Maple class

Our focus in Communication has been learning to make choices to help us tell others what we want, what we need and how we feel. We have been focusing on understanding questions and building our vocabulary to help us be more independent.



This term our overarching theme has been "The World Around Us". We have been exploring different cultures from around the world, reading stories related to them and discovering their culture, including music and art.

Our weekly visits around our local community have given us a better understanding of important life skills such as road safety, shopping and being aware of the immediate world around our class. We have also been looking at the wider areas of the world each morning, watching videos and looking at pictures of some countries that some of our class call home e.g. Poland, Ireland, Somalia, Pakistan amongst others. We have been deciding which places would be our choice if we could go and visit!

To celebrate **British Science Week** Cedar Class spent the week investigating the **connections** between things and how we can improve the world. 
