Dear Parents and Carers

Lavender Class have enjoyed our Tuesday morning trips to Wythenshawe Wheelers, exploring a range of different bikes with our friends.
















We contributed to the pride flag used in the Manchester festival. We chose green and red, and used different tactile materials to allow all students to engage with it.






















In our humanities this term we have been looking at ancient Egypt. We loved the mummies so we then tried to mummify our own fruit!

Hello from Pine class! As the end of Summer term approaches we would love to share with you what we have been doing in school.



Pine class

This term we have enjoyed lots of activities linked to our topic of Living Things. We really enjoyed learning about mini-beats! We had the chance to explore and interact with lots of wild and interesting insects, including Morio Worms, Locusts, Beetles and Stick Insects. We enjoyed exploring our local community and had trips to the park every week, no matter the weather! We have been able to take what we have learned outside and explore out local plants and animals.

We have also enjoyed lots of physical activities including cycling at Wythenshawe Park, PE with a Manchester City Coach and Rebound Therapy.

We have been learning to problem solve including opening a range of different boxes, containers and jars. We have also been using different kinds of puzzles to challenge our skills. We have been developing our visual and auditory memory, through a wide range of challenging activities.

We have been using a wide range of sensory activities to help us learn and every week we take part in a Sensory Story. These stories have focused on plants and animals and have included "Rumble in the Jungle", "There was an Old Lady who swallowed a fly" and "Jasper's Beanstalk".

Improving our communication

We have been working hard to improve our communication this year. We have used a variety of PECs symbols, electronic AAC devices and individual communication books across a variety of different activities and in different places. This has helped increase our confidence in speaking to others and reduced our frustrations, as a wider audience more easily understands our wants.







Making friends and sharing spaces

We have been building relationships with staff and other pupils. We have enjoyed visiting Wythenshawe Wheelers both as a class and with our friends from Willow Class. We learnt to share the bikes and relate well to different staff in both classes. We have also built relationships in class and learnt we can share our space with our preferred staff and share these staff with other pupils in class. Lastly, we have learnt to share our space whilst out in the community. We can now share tables with each other and next to unfamiliar people in public spaces.





We have had a trip to our local church to look at different symbols used in the church and had a lovely story read to us by the vicar.
