We have explored lots of different textures looking at the different properties of materials and enjoyed doing beach art.

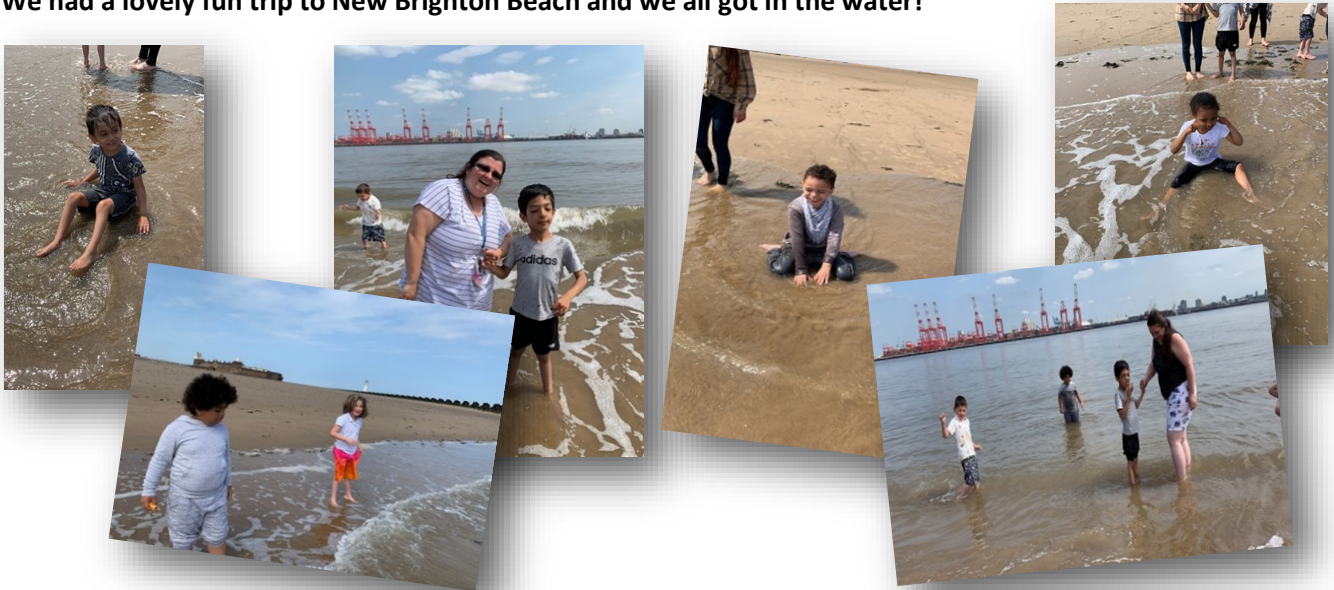


We have been strengthening our mark making skills; mark making in different textures.

We've been to the Blue Abyss in our sensory story, travelling deep into the ocean and being chased by sharks!



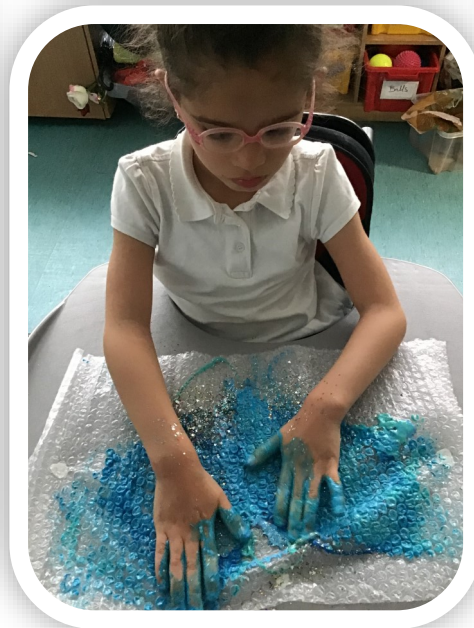
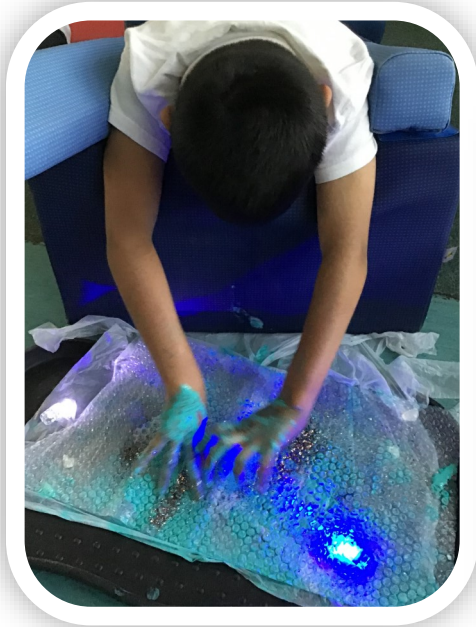
We have been able to control technology in different ways to make things happen.

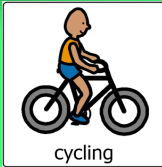

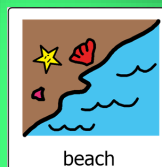
Pine class

We have continued to access our regular soft play sessions which are lots of fun and give us the opportunity to move around in a safe space.



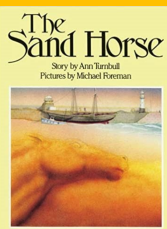
We have been exploring textures in our cognition sessions and listening to and playing musical instruments.

Beech class

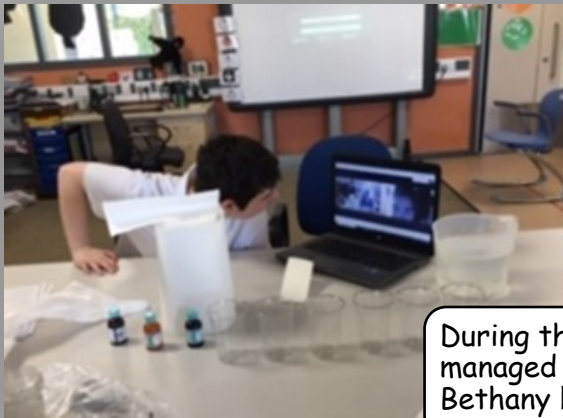

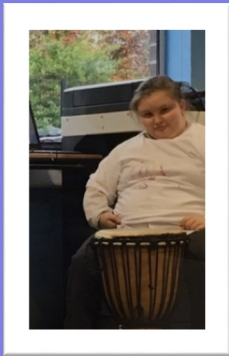

We are extremely proud of our Year 11 students who are leaving us this year to embark on their next chapter at their chosen destinations.

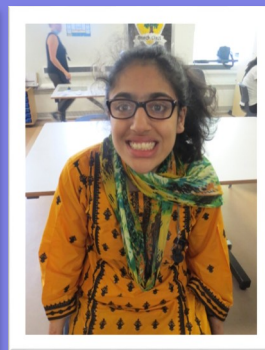
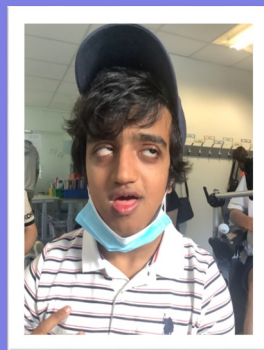

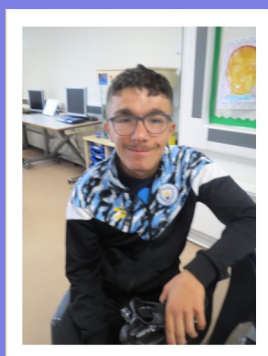
