
We have also been accessing the community and exploring our skills of making choices in public places, especially when it has been sunny. We have loved having ice lollies in the park and walking around our local community.

that live around water.






In Our Creative Curriculum we painted rain, puddles, drizzle using different techniques and used these paintings to decorate our very own rain maker and we listened to songs about saving water.

This half term our topic has been 'water' and we have had a great time playing, exploring and investigating water.

We worked on Touch and Communication activities using the stories 'Commotion in the Ocean' and 'Hey Water'. We used story props to support our learning.





We did some creativity projects focused on water such as seaside art. Pupils explored different textures, colours, scents and items linked to the sea.









During the term pupils focused on communicating their preferences and developing their anticipation skills.

Sunflower class

We have been using all of our senses to investigate colour, pattern, movement and the texture of water, with a focus

on the sea and creatures that live in the sea.





Sunflowers class have had an active and messy term as we explore our theme of 'Water.'





We focused our positive looking sessions on turning towards colour, fixing our gaze, and creating fountains of light.

This term Jasmine Class' topic has been 'Water', and we have explored this across all areas of the curriculum. We have been writing seaside-themed poetry and information leaflets about ocean animals and plastic pollution in Literacy, and we have studied the life and work of autistic environmental activist Greta Thunberg.

We have moulded clay into a variety of shapes to resemble fish body parts, and experimented with a range of materials to create fish scale designs. In Design and Technology we have used recyclable materials to create junk model boats, and have tested whether they float or sink in our school pond.

We had two really fun class trips as part of this topic. We first went to New Brighton Beach, where the children splashed around in the waves, built sandcastles, searched for rocks and shells, drew in the sand and chased the seagulls! We also enjoyed a special fish and chip lunch on the sand with their friends. After this, we went to Blue Planet Aquarium, where we saw a large variety of fish, sharks, and other marine animals.

Acorns class have enjoyed a number of school trips. The trips have enhanced the learning that has been taking place in the classroom thus been a memorable and relevant experience for our pupils. Here is a snapshot of what we have been doing...

For Knowsley Safari Park, the children were able to see different animals and enjoyed listening to a talk about elephants' teeth, which linked to our science topic. For RE, we have been looking at the importance of places of worship.



### Sycamore class

Our focus in Reasoning and Cognition has been Space, Shape and Measures. We have been using lots of different resources and games to help us understand number in concrete, pictorial and abstract ways. We have been exploring length, weight and capacity. Functional time is always a focus within our daily and weekly routines.



We've had a great Summer term exploring the theme of "Water". We have used water to explore our environment, using information and factual texts to explore the importance of water to us. We also explored water through music, dance and poetry, using familiar songs and poems to explore its importance. We have

used a range of stories and texts including Billy's Bucket, The Lighthouse Keeper, Rhythm of the Rain and The Drop in My Drink.







Our focus in Communication this term has been Phonics and Shared reading. We have been using lots of different sensory stories to help build our reading skills, our phonic knowledge, decoding and blending.

We have enjoyed taking part in a wide variety of activities to help us with our physical development, including our weekly swimming sessions which remain popular. Also our weekly PE session with Manchester City, learning new skills and teamwork! We have had access to coaching for tennis with the LTA, Wheelchair Rugby with Sale Sharks, sitting volleyball and Boccia. Sports week in June was a great success with the while class participating across a range of activities.



Rowan class went on an end of year trip to Planet Ice to do some ice skating. Our theme of this term has been ways of traveling in water, so we went to see how you travel on ice. Some of the parents joined us and had fun exploring how we move on ice.

We made bird feeders to hang outside our classroom window. It's tricky to use the tools on your own so we had to **help each other**.










We **worked as a team** to refurbish an old bench. It looks much better now!


