## Lavender class

We have explored this by looking at how we can move our body and exploring our immediate environment.



We have explored how our bodies change through movement.

We have done this through our writing, changing amounts in maths and our physical skills such as rolling a ball in our Manchester City sessions and bouncing in rebound sessions.

This term we have been learning all about Autumn and we have read the story *'It was a cold dark night!'* The children have explored lots of sensory items linked to the story. We have been on autumnal walks in the local community and created lovely autumn artwork to display in class.

Bluebells have been reading the class book 'Some Things Change' and noticing changes in colour, size and shape through their science work, using a range of toys, lights and food.






We have worked on our independence skills to make toast, crumpets, pancakes, bagels and waffles. We worked hard to open containers and spread getting noticeably better each week and used these skills when we cooked food for our MFL day.

Our Art work this term has been focused around primary colours, exploring and mixing them. Our play area is full of our artwork, pieces with single colour, with 3 primary colours and some with patterns based on the Ndebele women's decorated houses. We also used primary colours to mix our own orange for a pumpkin and green for a Christmas Tree.



## **Blossom class**



In English, we have been exploring stories such as, '*The Cautious Caterpillar*' and '*Don't Hog The Hedge'*. We have enjoyed accessing these stories and engaged with puppets and fine motor skill activities.

In our Maths work we have been working at our own levels involving counting, sorting, looking at size and exploring shapes.



We have also been developing life skills by going on community walks, visiting the school café, going out to the sensory garden and attending regular sessions to the library.





We have enjoyed weekly sessions at school with a Manchester City coach, where we have been focusing on improving our gross motor skills and working together as a team. This term Jasmine class have been exploring changes in materials. During this time, we have used our Science, Art and Enrichment sessions to explore a range of different materials.

# Jasmine class







We have focused on using our senses: looking, listening, touching, smelling and tasting (where appropriate) to make observations about many different materials and their changing states.

Acorn class

Acorns class have been exploring magnets this half term; we explored what objects are attracted to or repelled by them. We have used this knowledge to make magnet maze sensory bottles. The pupils had to use a magnet to get metal objects out of the bottle. We also tried to make a compass using a paper clip and a bottle cap.

Magnolia have been enjoying the theme of **Changes** by looking at the seasons. We explored the changing colour of the leaves and listened to the sounds they make. We looked at Autumnal colours by mixing paint and making leaf prints with our feet.



We enjoyed stories like "We're Going on a Leaf Hunt" and listening to different sounds on that journey, like snapping twigs in the forest, crunching leaves, or swooshing waterfalls.



### Magnolia Class



Magnolia enjoyed dancing together in their PE this term and learning about movement in different directions.

We explored different sounds things can make by putting different things in tins and shaking them.





Rowan have had a fabulous term full of adventures and discoveries. We went on a visit to Manchester City Stadium and the Children's Adventure Farm (CAFT) where students enjoyed some Christmas celebrations.

Students have explored 'Changes' through different activities such as stories, sensory and my cognition.





We have expressed ourselves through our Creative activities where the students have been able to learn about different Celebrations and Cultures.





We are working to enhance our understanding of daily routine by using a huge variety of cues such as now + next, key words and sensory cues. We have also increased our knowledge of basic BSL.

Sycamore have had a fabulous start to the year and have taken part in a wide range in activities. We have all enjoyed attending

swimming each Friday and have grown in confidence in the water, improved our independence skills especially with dressing and some of us have gained certificates with our swimming.

## Sycamore class

We have enjoyed a range of other sporting activities throughout the term. This has included weekly sessions with Manchester City coaches where we have really improved on working together as a team. We have also benefitted of time with Sale Sharks Wheel Chair Rugby coaches. We have learnt how to manoeuvre a wheelchair and throw and catch





In addition to all these practical activities we have also worked really hard on our reading, writing and maths skills.

We have gained confidence in the kitchen and are understanding a range of terms which help us including *chop, cut, stir, mix* as well as remembering that we need to wash our hands before we start and that we have to wash up when we have finished.

We have had lots of opportunities to explore moving our bodies in different ways through a variety of sports and activities.

Games - We have worked with Amy from Manchester City, developing our turn taking skills, throwing, catching and aiming at a target.



**Swimming** - Some of us have attended swimming sessions at Hough End Leisure Centre. We have enjoyed having fun in the water and we are getting more confident putting our faces in the water.



#### Tennis - This half term we have attended tennis coaching sessions wi



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coaching sessions with **Andy from We Do Tennis**. We have been practicing throwing and catching with a variety of objects including scarfs, balls and hoops.



**Rebound** - We have loved our Friday rebound sessions with Lynsey from Jump Space. We have practiced jumping on our bottoms and feet. We have enjoyed it so much that we had our class trip to the Jump Space venue in Stockport!

Pine class have been following simple recipes during cooking sessions. We have made fruit salad, pizza and milkshakes.





During art we celebrated different festivals. We created some beautiful autumn art, rice Rangoli patterns and some lovely poppy art for remembrance day.

Students have enjoyed accessing this as a sensory story. All students have really enjoyed engaging with the props and objects!

Our focus in Birch class this term has been around friendships and play, linked to our Rights Respecting School Article, 31. We have enjoyed playing alongside our friends, learning about sharing and taking turns.









In Birch Class we have been on two fantastic trips, one to Manchester Museum as part of our science topic and the other to Boomerang for our Christmas trip. Much fun was had by all!









# Willow class

This term Willow Class have experienced lots of CHANGES! We have had the opportunity to enjoy more outdoor and socialisation opportunities, as we now eat in the dinner hall and have a shared outdoor playtime with our friends. We have

also been on two class trips to explore our local community – Bridgewater Hall for an SEN music concert, and Children's Adventure Farm Trust for our Christmas Trip.



In class, we have been working really hard to develop our fine and gross motor skills, and tolerance to tactile stimuli, through bi-weekly MOVE and My Body carousels. The students enjoy the PMLD swing, rebound trampoline, round and peanut balls to bounce and rock on, and being supported into their standing frames/ lying on their backs/ over a wedge to stretch whilst getting their fingers moving in different textures. ### Beech class Wow Moment: Inflating Balloons with Science!

We explored a fascinating experiment using vinegar and bicarbonate of soda to inflate balloons. This exciting activity was part of our science learning, and everyone got involved in their own way!

**Step 1:** We poured vinegar into bottles watching it Carefully bubble as we worked.

**Step 2:** We added biCarbonate of soda to balloons, feeling its grainy texture.

Step 3: The magic happened! When we attaChed the balloons to the bottles and watChed the reaction, gas filled the balloons, making them expand like magic!

The room was filled with awe and

laughter as we saw science in action. This experiment was not just fun-it was a WOW

#### CREATING SAFE AND INSPIRING PLACES TO LEARN

We are continuing our rights respecting work across school, working towards achieving Gold status.

To achieve Gold we are ...

- Teaching the whole school about rights so that the whole school knows about children's rights, and this knowledge is used to improve child wellbeing and the school as a whole.
- Teaching through rights, ensuring that the planning and structures that underpin school life are rights respecting.
- Teaching and learning **for** rights, looking out to the wider community and beyond, becoming active global citizens.

We try to provide the opportunity to as many pupils as possible to have a say in matters affecting them. With this in mind,

we have 2 new steering groups set up to help support and guide the school towards our gold accreditation in July. One group consists of pupils from our semi formal classes and the other group has pupils representing our formal learners.



#### World Children's Day

This year was the 35th anniversary of World Children's Day which is celebrated every year on 20th November. Pupils from all classes took part in activities that were appropriate to them. Some classes had a student 'take over' day, some classes designed some posters representing their favourite child's right and some classes participated in sensory or creative activities.
